HOMEBRED AND COUNTY BRED CLASSES

HOMEBRED: The goal of the Homebred class is to recognize 4-H and FFA members who are breeding, raising, and showing their own market livestock. This recognition program is a way of extending acknowledgement to members that put time and effort into a project throughout the entire year by maintaining a breeding animal and then carrying the offspring as a market project.

To be a homebred animal, the mother of the offspring has to be owned by the member or immediate family at the time of the breeding and the birth and rearing of the animal, which resulted in the project. A member must also be carrying a breeding project in that species in order to show a homebred project. All homebred animals will automatically be County Bred.

The homebred project animal does not have to be offspring of the animal used as the youths breed project. Carrying a breeding project means that the youth has identified a breeding project and is carrying a record/project book on that animal. **IT DOES NOT MEAN THAT ANIMAL HAS TO SHOW AT THE FAIR!** But the record book on that animal will have to be up to date and present at check-in.

Homebred animals have to be designated at the time of weigh-in or tagging. Any animal not designated at this time will not be acknowledged as a homebred animal. The highest placing homebred animal in each weight class will be brought back in to the ring after the selection of champions to compete for Champion and Reserve Homebred.

Animals will receive a rosette and will be designated in the program and sale catalog. Sale placing will not be affected.

COUNTYBRED: The goal of the County Bred class is to encourage and acknowledge 4-H and FFA members to purchase animals, which have been bred within Westmoreland County. This will encourage close working relationships between livestock producers in the county and the youth members and organizations.

To be a County Bred animal, the project animal has to be bred by a Westmoreland County producer or a family that participates in the youth programs of Westmoreland County. Animals must be bred and born within Westmoreland County. Animals purchased at sales within the county but not produced by a livestock producer from within the county are not eligible.

County Bred animals have to be designated at the time of weigh-ins or tagging, late designations will not be accepted! These classifications will be used by the following market animals, Steers, Lambs, Hogs, and Goats. For more information on these opportunities please contact the Extension Office. The breeder's name and address must be given at the time of designation. Any animal not designated at this time will not be acknowledged as a County Bred animal. The highest placing County Bred animal in each weight class will be brought back into the ring after the selection of Homebred Champions to compete for Champion and Reserve County Bred.

Animals will receive a rosette and be designated in the program and sale catalog. Sale placing will not be affected.

4-H AND VOCATIONAL AGRICULTURE

Eligibility: 4-H club members must have passed their eighth birthday but not have passed their nineteenth birthday by January 1 of the current year. Exhibitors must be 4-H members, carrying a project in the field in which they wish to make entry and be under the supervision of the Pennsylvania State University Cooperative Extension service by June 1 preceding the fair.

Students enrolled in an accepted vocational school curriculum must be conducting a project in the class in which they wish to make entry. 4-H and FFA members participating in contests in Division 10 will be admitted free on the day of the contest if pre-entered.

Entries limited to Westmoreland County.

All showmanship classes will be shown prior to market and breed classes.

Refer to Jr. Livestock Handbook available at the Extension Office.



DAIRY & LIVESTOCK EXHIBITOR RULES

1. 4-H and FFA exhibitors showing in both open class and junior classes must pay an entry fee for each division and submit separate entry blanks.
2. Livestock and dairy exhibitors must have a completed up-to-date project book for the animal to be shown. Junior show superintendents must have these books checked before any animals are judged.
3. **Animals in breed classes must have registration papers in the exhibitors name or a lease agreement, as required in each species section. All breeding projects must be owned and identified by June 1 of current project year.**

Market livestock must all attend and be identified at designated countywide identification day!

4. If there is a valid reason that the exhibitor cannot show his/her animal(s) then another member who meets the requirements may show that animal(s); however, this member will not qualify for showmanship contest. **Exhibitors not showing their own animals must notify the show superintendent before entering the ring.**
5. Exhibitors may show an overweight or underweight animal in showmanship classes only, if they do not have an animal of that species, including breeding projects that is eligible. One overweight or underweight animal per exhibitor will remain on the fair grounds but will not be sold through the Westmoreland Jr. Livestock Sale. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to remove the animal from the fair grounds at the closing of the fair.
6. During the Westmoreland Fair project grooming of any kind is limited to Westmoreland County 4-H or FFA members with assistance of current Westmoreland County 4-H leaders or FFA advisors, and immediate family. Any exhibitors witnessed violating this policy by a Superintendent, Jr. Livestock Committee member or a Fair board member will be removed from competition in that species following a discussion with violator and said representative.
7. No artificial hair or material is to be used to enhance an animal's appearance. No coloring agents are to be used on any market or breeding animals. White towel or glove test may be used as a check. No aerosol cans or pressurized containers will be in makeup area.

8. Unethical or abusive activities are not allowed and will result in disqualification of the exhibitor from the show and forfeiture of premiums.
9. Junior exhibitors are not permitted to have their animals in barns other than their designated stall area.
10. Classes with exhibitor's age classifications are ages as of January 1 of the current year.
11. Exhibitors should dress appropriately for the species they are exhibiting. Clean, neat apparel in all cases. Dairy exhibitors are required to wear all white for the showmanship contest.
12. Exhibitors, when provided, must wear designated exhibitor identification ie. Hat, back number, etc.
13. **4-H and FFA exhibitors are limited to selling 4 lots through the Westmoreland Jr. Livestock Sale. These lots may consist of 4 live animals. An exhibitor may sell 6 lots through the sale if one lot is the Champion or Reserve Champion Carcass Hog/Champion or Reserve Champion Carcass Lamb.**
14. **Important:** Animals consigned for slaughter during or immediately following the show shall not receive any treatment with drugs or biologics within the withdrawal time prior to slaughter. Withdrawal times for drugs and biologics are all stated on the directions for use. Label directions must be followed at all times. If upon slaughter a recent treatment with drugs or biologics is the cause of condemnation of a carcass the loss of the carcass will be borne by the exhibitor. **The Fair Management reserves the right to test any animals for the illegal use of drugs or antibiotics.**
15. **Junior market livestock exhibitors are responsible for their animals until 1:00pm Sunday close of the fair.**
16. All animals must be housed in barns only.
17. Overfitting of cattle is discouraged. Any artificial means used to change the form or shape of an animal will disqualify it from competition.
18. **NOTICE: Do not enter animals that you have no intentions of bringing (ex. For tack space) this will lead to loss of premiums.**
19. All 4-H and FFA members must show their own animals in showmanship. No substitutes.
20. ****NEW** All livestock exhibitors are responsible for their own bedding.**
21. For further clarification of these rules, please see the Westmoreland County Junior Livestock Handbook, available at the Westmoreland County Extension Office.

PREMIER JUNIOR LIVESTOCK SHOWMANSHIP CONTEST

Westmoreland County 4-H & FFA Market Chicken Pen Information

1. Market Chicken project is open to any 4-H or FFA member of Westmoreland County. All Market Chicken project exhibitors must follow all General Rules and Regulations established by the Westmoreland County Jr. Livestock Committee.
2. All Market Chickens must be in exhibitor's ownership by July 15 and verified by club leader. Each bird will be individually identified with official leg bands.
3. All Market Chicken Pens will be weighed at the fairgrounds on the first Saturday of the fair at designated location and time. Each chicken must weigh at least 4lbs. but not more than 10 lbs. A pen will consist of 3 birds. Each member may bring one spare chicken to the fairgrounds to replace one that does not meet weight requirements. Only 3 birds will be weighed unless 1 bird does not make weight. The pen will be disqualified if any one chicken is disqualified because of weight.
4. The Champion and Reserve Champion Pens will be sold through the Junior Livestock Sale.
5. If one or more chickens in a pen die before the sale the pen is automatically disqualified from the sale.

This contest will utilize ultrasound technology to evaluate all of the market steers entered at the Westmoreland Fair. This would not allow an additional steer to be entered. The number per exhibitor would remain at 2 steers, with both of them competing in the market steer and carcass contest. The ultrasound technician will evaluate the steers using ultrasound measurements for back fat, rib eye area, and quality grade taken from each steer. These measurements as well as a standard calculation for hot carcass weight and yield grade will be used to formulate the final carcass placing.

All vaccine label directions must be followed, and the final dose of vaccine must be administered at least 15 days prior to entry into the exhibition. All rabies vaccinated dogs must be accompanied by a rabies vaccination certificate which must contain information fields consistent with the current version of the National Association of State Public Health Veterinarians Rabies Compendium (including, but not limited to, animal identification, breed, sex, age and color; the vaccination tag number; the vaccine name, lot number, duration of immunity, and manufacturer; and the date of vaccination), and must be accurately and legibly completed. The certificate must contain legible name and contact information of the veterinarian who administered the vaccine. A copy of the rabies vaccination certificate is acceptable.
- The Dog Show will be held in the 4-H horse ring outside the fair grounds.
- No dogs will be permitted on the fairgrounds.
 1. Open to 4-H club members currently enrolled in the 4-H dog project
 2. All entries will be required to show in their respective grooming, showmanship and obedience classes; except when a dog is in season and may be shown in grooming and showmanship classes but not in obedience.
 3. Third year dog project members and older must show in advanced division of showmanship.
 4. Obedience classification of the 4-H member will be at the discretion of his leader.
 5. Dog Round-up will be run under the county 4-H dog rules.
