HEALTH RULES FOR HORSES

1. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued after May 1, 2010 is required. Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA) test results and date of the test must be included on the CVI.

The following vaccinations are required for all horses and **must be noted on Certificate of Veterinary Inspection form AAI-13**:

- Rabies
 - Tetanus
 - Influenza
 - Encephalomyelitis E. & W. & Venezuelan
 - Rhinopneumonitis
2. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this is required on the CVI (the statement is pre-printed on the CVI). Animals appearing unhealthy upon arrival may not enter the exhibition grounds.

Animals are not to be unloaded until health requirements are checked.

3. An *Animal Owner or Caretaker's Verification of Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship (VCPR)* form must accompany each animal, and must be presented upon arrival at the exhibition.
4. All equine animals must have tested negative for EIA by an official test within the 12 months prior to the opening date of the exhibition. Laboratory test results must accompany each animal to its final destination (a copy of the original lab report is acceptable). Foals less than 6 months of age accompanied by a dam, which meets the above requirements, are exempt from EIA testing requirements. If the foal is not accompanied by the dam, a copy of the dam's test results must accompany the foal to its final destination.
5. A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is required for animals 3 months of age and older. However, if a mare was currently vaccinated against rabies when she foaled, the foal is not required to be vaccinated until six months of age, with a second vaccination administered two-four weeks later. All vaccine label directions must be followed, and all rabies vaccinated equine animals must be accompanied by a rabies vaccination certificate or the vaccination information must be included on the CVI. If a rabies vaccination certificate is provided, the certificate must contain legible name and contact information of the veterinarian who administered the vaccine and the veterinarian's signature. A copy of the rabies vaccination certificate is acceptable. The CVI is the preferred document.

Out of State Horses:

1. **Certificate of Veterinary Inspection form AAI-13 required within 30 days of entrance into show.** The CVI shall include a statement verifying that "all animals identified on this certificate of veterinary inspection have been examined and found to be free from Vesicular Stomatitis (VS). During the past 90 days, these animals have neither been exposed to VS nor located within 10 miles of a site where VS has been diagnosed.
2. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases.

3. An *Animal Owner or Caretaker's Verification of Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship* (VCPR) form must accompany each animal, and must be presented upon arrival at the exhibition.
4. All equine animals must test negative for EIA by an official test within the 12 months prior to the opening date of the exhibition. Laboratory test results must accompany each animal to its final destination (a copy of the original lab report is acceptable). Foals less than six months of age accompanied by a dam which meets the above requirements are exempt from EIA testing requirements. If the foal is not accompanied by the dam, a copy of the dam's test results must accompany the foal to its final destination.
5. A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is required for animals three months of age and older. However, if a mare was currently vaccinated against rabies when she foaled, the foal is not required to be vaccinated until six months of age, with a second vaccination administered two-four weeks later. All vaccine label directions must be followed, and all rabies vaccinated equine animals must be accompanied by a rabies vaccination certificate or the vaccination information must be included on the CVI. The certificate must contain legible name and contact information of the veterinarian who administered the vaccine and the veterinarian's signature. A copy of the original rabies vaccination certificate is acceptable.
6. If an equine animal has resided in Texas for a cumulative total of 30 days or more within the six months preceding the date of entry into the Commonwealth, that animal must be test-negative for Piroplasmiasis on a competitive enzyme-linked immunosorbent assay (c-ELISA) test, or a Department-approved equivalent test, with the test occurring within the 30 days preceding entry into Pennsylvania. This requirement shall not be applicable to an equine animal that is being transported through the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to another State, and that is not offloaded or commingled with other equine animals while within the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. The written laboratory test report, confirming compliance with the requirement described in the preceding paragraph, shall accompany the equine animal in transit to a destination within the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania; and the date of test and the test results shall be written on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.
7. Vaccinations against the following contagious diseases are also recommended: Rabies, Equine influenza, EHV, and Triple E.

1. No horse or team of horses shall be entitled to a premium unless serviceably sound.
 2. Exhibitors may be limited to 8 per exhibitor depending on space availability.
 3. Horses entered as matched pairs must be owned by one person or firm.
 4. Animals or combinations of animals owned by one exhibitor may be entered in the classes below.
 5. No grade stallions shall be accepted for entry.
 6. All animals entered must compete and be shown.
 7. Above rules and regulations apply to all horses.
 8. Ages to be reckoned as of August 1.
 9. All entries in Section 1 must show registration papers.
 10. All entries subject to veterinarian examination. Animals considered unhealthy by examining veterinarian will be excused from the grounds immediately.
 11. All horses are to remain in their stalls after 4pm unless participating in a show.
 12. Classifications and premiums are to apply to each of the following breeds:

DRAFT HORSE PULLING CONTEST

DATE OF CONTEST - Saturday, August 28, 2010 - Noon

Place of Contest – Grandstand Arena, Westmoreland Fairgrounds

- All entries must adhere to the Equine Regulations for Pennsylvania Fairs for health, including the Coggins Test as stated in General Rules for Horses.
- The contest will follow the rules of the **Laurel Highland Horse Pulling Association**.

OBJECT

The value of draft animals depends upon their ability to pull, and capacity to endure sustained efforts. The object of this test is to determine the sustained maximum pulling capacity of each pair. These tests will also afford valuable scientific data on the relation between form and function in draft animals, and will stimulate general interest in the breeding and use of good draft horses.

In particular it is desired:

1. To demonstrate the value of type, soundness and proper breeding in the selection of horses intended for long and arduous draft work.
2. To ascertain and to demonstrate the proper method of training and conditioning of horse for long and severe draft work.
3. To encourage horsemanship in fitting harness and in driving.
4. To demonstrate the maximum pulling capacity of the horse.
