HEALTH RULES FOR HORSES

1. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued within the 30 days prior to the opening date of the exhibition is required. Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA) test results and date of the test must be included on the CVI.

The following vaccinations are required for all horses and **must be noted on Certificate of Veterinary Inspection form AAI-13 issued after May 1st and prior to 30 days of the opening of the exhibition:**

- Rabies
 - Tetanus
 - Influenza
 - Encephalomyelitis E. & W. & Venezuelan
 - Rhinopneumonitis
2. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this is required on the CVI (the statement is pre-printed on the CVI). Animals appearing unhealthy upon arrival may not enter the exhibition grounds.

Animals are not to be unloaded until health requirements are checked.

3. An *Animal Owner or Caretaker's Verification of Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship (VCPR)* form must accompany each animal, and must be presented upon arrival at the exhibition.
4. All equine animals must have tested negative for EIA by an official test within the 12 months prior to the opening date of the exhibition. A copy of the official test results must accompany each animal to its final destination. Foals less than 6 months of age accompanied by a dam which meets the above requirements are exempt from EIA testing requirements. If the foal is not accompanied by the dam, a copy of the dam's test results must accompany the foal to its final destination.
5. A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is required for animals 3 months of age and older. All vaccine label directions must be followed, and all rabies vaccinated equine animals must be accompanied by a rabies vaccination certificate or the vaccination information must be included on the CVI. If a rabies vaccination certificate is provided, the certificate must contain legible name and contact information of the veterinarian who administered the vaccine and the veterinarian's signature. A copy of the rabies vaccination certificate is acceptable. The CVI is the preferred document.

Out of State Horses:

1. **Certificate of Veterinary Inspection form AAI-13 required within 30 days of entrance into show.** The certificate shall specify the results of tests conducted, along with the date of administration of the tests, and the product used for vaccines that have been administered.
2. Equidae imported into this Commonwealth for exhibition purposes shall be negative to an official AGID or ELISA blood test for EIA conducted by a Federally-approved laboratory within 12 months prior to date of entry. A copy of the official test shall accompany the animal to its final destination.
3. Foals under six months of age, accompanied by dam with negative EIA test, do not require a negative test.

4. A permit issued by the Department is required before importing equidae from a state or area wherein a state or Federal quarantine is invoked to prevent the spread of a contagious or infectious disease of equidae.
5. Vaccinations against the following contagious diseases are also recommended: Rabies, Equine influenza, EHV, and Triple E.

1. No horse or team of horses shall be entitled to a premium unless serviceably sound.
2. Exhibitors may be limited to 8 per exhibitor depending on space availability.
3. Horses entered as matched pairs must be owned by one person or firm.
4. Animals or combinations of animals owned by one exhibitor may be entered in the classes below.
5. No grade stallions shall be accepted for entry.
6. All animals entered must compete and be shown.
7. Above rules and regulations apply to all horses.
8. Ages to be reckoned as of August 1.
9. All entries in Section 1 must show registration papers.
10. All entries subject to veterinarian examination. Animals considered unhealthy by examining veterinarian will be excused from the grounds immediately.

DRAFT HORSE PULLING CONTEST

DATE OF CONTEST - Saturday, August 29, 2009 - Noon

**Open to Pennsylvania Residents. Drivers must also be PA residents.
Place of Contest – Grandstand Arena, Westmoreland Fairgrounds**

- All entries must adhere to the Equine Regulations for Pennsylvania Fairs for health, including the Ciggins Test as stated in General Rules for Horses.
- The contest will follow the rules of the **Laurel Highland Horse Pulling Association.**

OBJECT

The value of draft animals depends upon their ability to pull, and capacity to endure sustained efforts. The object of this test is to determine the sustained maximum pulling capacity of each pair. These tests will also afford valuable scientific data on the relation between form and function in draft animals, and will stimulate general interest in the breeding and use of good draft horses.

In particular it is desired:

1. To demonstrate the value of type, soundness and proper breeding in the selection of horses intended for long and arduous draft work.
2. To ascertain and to demonstrate the proper method of training and conditioning of horse for long and severe draft work.
3. To encourage horsemanship in fitting harness and in driving.
4. To demonstrate the maximum pulling capacity of the horse.
